NOTICE: UPDATED RECOMMENDED THERAPEUTIC ALTERNATIVES FOR BENZATHINE BENZYLPENICILLIN INJECTION

The Primary Health Care, Adult and Paediatric Hospital Level Standard Treatment Guidelines (STGs) and Essential Medicines List (EML) currently recommend the use of benzathine benzylpenicillin for various indications.

There is an ongoing supply problem with benzathine benzylpenicillin, which has necessitated the use of alternative procurement methods and/or the sourcing of alternative therapeutic options.

This updated circular¹ reinforces the recommendations to restrict the use of benzathine benzylpenicillin* and recommends alternatives, including the option to use doxycycline for latent syphilis²³.

*Note: Benzathine benzylpenicillin is the recommended treatment for syphilis in children and pregnant women. In pregnancy, azithromycin does not effectively treat syphilis in the foetus, and resistance develops rapidly to azithromycin.

It is recommended that Pharmaceutical and Therapeutics Committees implement strategies for the rational use of the limited supplies of benzathine benzylpenicillin available.

In the event that there is no benzathine benzylpenicillin injection available at your facility, the recommended therapeutic alternatives listed in the STGs and EML and on contract for use in both Adults and Paediatrics include:

Severe penicillin allergy:

Consider using a macrolide e.g. azithromycin, only where appropriate. Refer to the STGs and EML for recommendations for specific indications and doses.

Accessing Section 21 benzathine benzylpenicillin:

The National Department of Health (NDoH) has facilitated the procurement of an emergency bulk section 21 of benzathine benzylpenicllin. South African Health Products Regulatory Authority (SAHPRA) granted the following section 21 authorisation to NDoH:
